SELF-HARM IS OFTEN HIDDEN, EVEN ONLINE

We examined Instagram and Twitter exchanges using social media listening tools of open accounts of people who self-harm were mined.

71% of the identified accounts belonged to females. As many platforms block terms linked to harmful behaviours, terminology evolves as users develop new words and phrases, and the most graphic and harmful material is confined to exchanges in private accounts.
